No Display:

Check power indicator through small hole on front:

If power LED is Blue check input connections are correctly connected

If Power LED is Amber please cycle power the Teleprompter may have gone in to energy saving Deep Sleep Mode.

Check a compatible signal resolution is being sent

No Power:

Check and replace fuse on side of teleprompter with one of the correct specification

Check input power cable for loose connections or faults.

Check input power plug fuse (if fitted)

Important safety instructions:

Please read the following instructions carefully.

Be sure that your Teleprompter is electrically rated to operate with the AC power available in your location.

1. To clean the Teleprompter monitor screen:

(a) Turn off the Teleprompter and unplug the power cord.

(b) Carefully remove acrylic protection cover (if fitted)

(c) Spray a non-solvent, non-abrasive cleaning solution onto a clean, lint free cloth and clean the screen gently. Be sure to lightly blot the surface, rather than applying pressure as you clean.

(d) NEVER SPRAY OR POUR ANY LIQUID DIRECTLY ONTO THE SCREEN OR CASE.

(e) PLEASE DO NOT USE ANY AMMONIA OR ALCOHOL-BASED CLEANERS ON THE Teleprompter DISPLAY SCREEN OR CASE.

2. Do not place the Teleprompter near a window.

Exposing the Teleprompter to rain, moisture or sunlight can severely damage it.

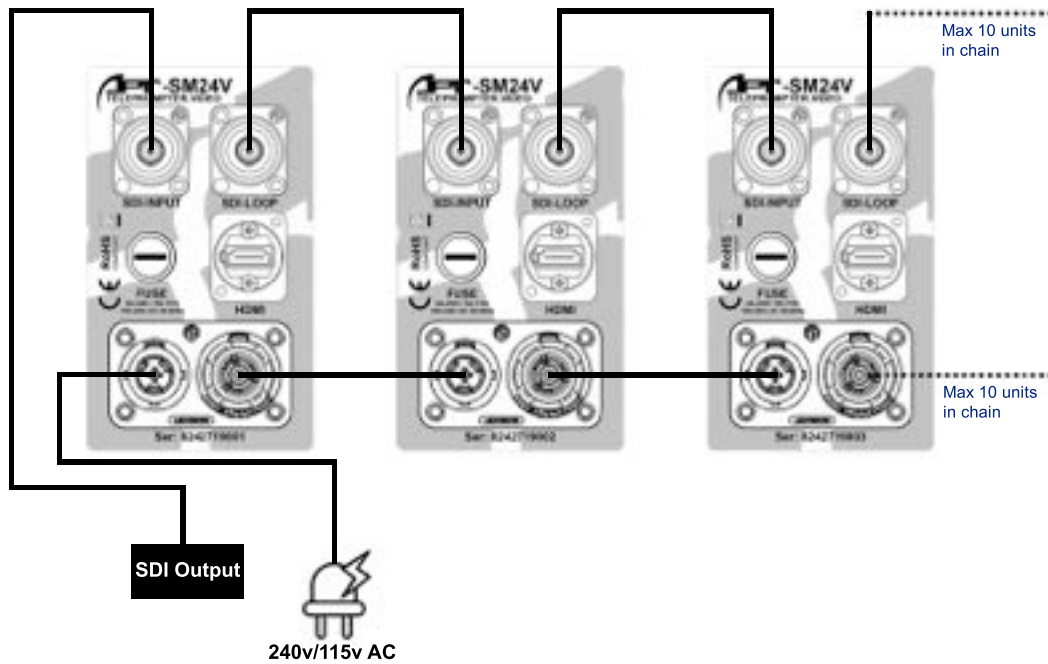

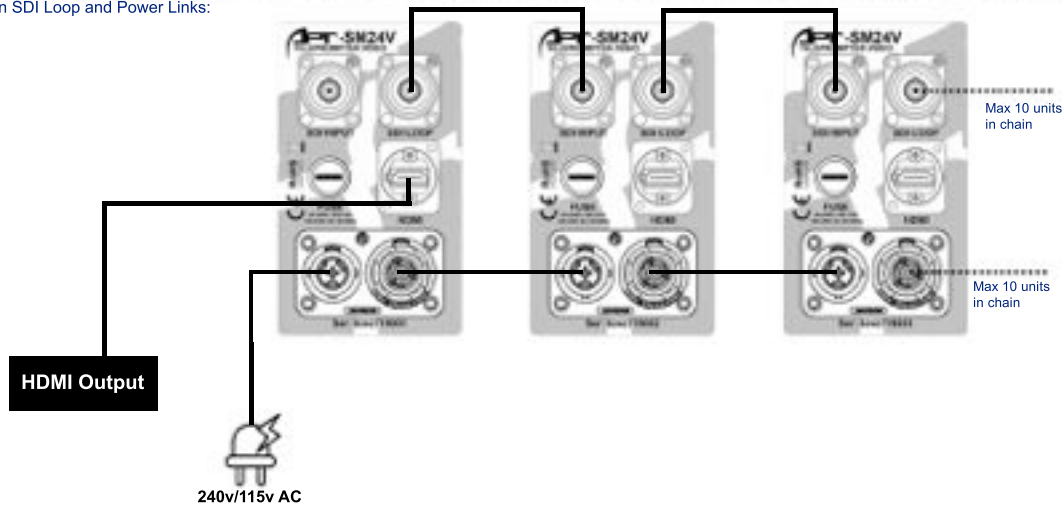

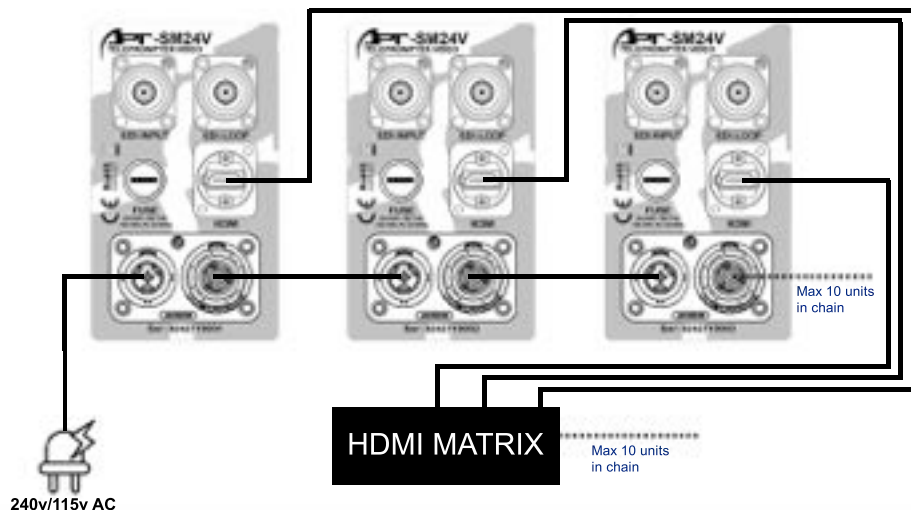

Hinge Instructions:

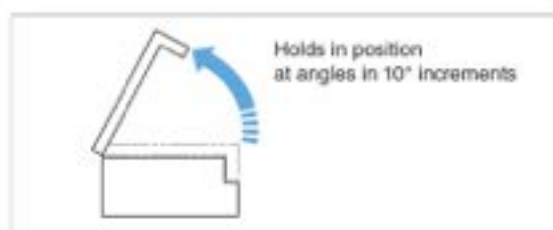
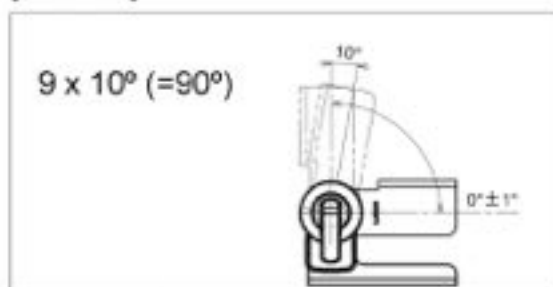
Before operating the hinge lift screen slightly to relieve pressure from the locking pin.

Adjustable from flat to 90° and 10° increments.
